An overview of what a Calvary student must do to be mentored for a B.Min programme.

Follow the Steps

The attached documents are packed with information. They are set out to make it easy to understand if carefully read. Think about the details when you complete the forms. This will help us to contact you or to understand who you are and how we can give you an RPL benefit.

The following page will show you a series of logical steps. This process will help you decide to follow a programme (a group of courses) which suits you and takes you further from WHERE YOU ARE. Determining this vital position of **where you are** is called **R**ecognition of **P**rior **L**earning – **RPL**.

Read the Information

It is always good to read an important paragraph twice. To remain compact, forms often have little room. Read the fine print which will prevent misunderstanding. Read the headings again and see if you reach the correct totals where applicable. Look how the example was filled in.

Work out a rough trial Plan

Print out the different forms and try to fill it in as a first rough exercise. This is extremely important since it may greatly influence your future. If you have a Diploma in Theology or Ministry you may continue with the B.Min. Mark some modules on the Tutor progress report as RPL if you have done such a course before in a similar way. To give proof of **Prior Learning**, use the set of **four forms** for your application to be considered. Add the RPL credits you claim and the **selected courses** to make a total of 150 credits.

Be precise: check it twice. Redo all your calculations. Your RPL claims will be evaluated and may not be accepted. Be honest and reasonable.

Follow through on your Decision

Involve the Tutor who has presented these documents to you. Doing these courses will improve your life and your skills. The more you study, the better. Start now by sending in the forms and apply for the Study Guide. Be prepared to pay for the first 25% of the mentoring as well as the registration fee. Read the Study Guide carefully and prepare to hand in the first two assignments. These will then be marked and returned to you. Act today.

Study Steps to a Qualification

A step by step guide for enrolling for a B.Min qualification at Calvary mentored by us

**e-Learning:
Register Students**

Complete the Calvary University Registration form which requires an initial fee of R650. Add this figure to the first 25% of the enrollment fee.



2

**Inform:
Mentor Fees**

These are the fees we ask to mentor a student for a programme over and above the registration fees a student has paid at a place of Higher Education. Ask for the **separate fees document**.



3

**Catch Up: (RPL)
Bridge Courses**

Tell us what you want to do and what you have done and experienced in the past. You will get credit for what you can do. This is a **separate** document.



4

**Open:
Study Record**

This is a hard copy of your own student's record of the marks data-base, should you move to another Tuition Centre you may ask to take this record with you.



5

**Record:
Study Progress**

A standardised form for recording achievement in tests, tasks and assignments for all 27 assignments, grouped together as 8 courses.



6

**Finalise Studies:
Agreement** (with tutor)

This is a separate **Student Agreement** which you should sign and will be held to during the time you study. Discuss this with your own Mentoring Tutor.

7

**Analyse:
Student Profile**

Knowing yourself better to understand what the motivators are in your life. It will be of great advantage to the tutor.

Register with Calvary University

We will only mentor students that have made a decision to study with an e-learning university of their choice and who then register with them. If their choice is Calvary University, they complete the form and pay in \$85 in the form of an amount in **Rands** (R650) on the day of registration.

Enrol with Calvary Academics

To get the student on record with us, the student must fill in the application form and write in the courses he/she will take or indicate "27 assignments" in the case of the **Ministry B.Min**. In all cases, whether a student takes **CU courses or not**, the old student number is not used and the student is a "Calvary Academics" student, mentored by us. Use/get the CU number. Please make sure that a photo is supplied and copies of ID and qualification.

Complete a Progress Report Form

For the B.Min a special 8 courses report form is available to go back and forth with the assignments to be marked. The 6 to 9 courses is used for any other purpose where CU courses are involved, even for the Masters where students do from 2 to 6 or more courses apart from the Dissertation.

Two Kinds of Masters

Depending on whether a student has done an Honours degree and if not he/she is over 40 years old, the **combined masters** may be applied for.

Special Post-Graduate forms

Candidates (not called students any more) who do postgraduate M/D studies must fill in and use the **PG Study Record** and also the progress report.

Payments and Books

The registration fee to CU is immediate and dealt with first at FNB. The B.Min course is paid in exactly 4 payments as described elsewhere. The CU courses have textbooks which have to be paid cash. The **CU courses** are paid for according to an arrangement: once, 4 payments or 10 payments. Whenever a payment is made to us, please document it clearly and fax to (012) 567 5550. Remember that postage must be included for books. **CU courses** also come with CDs onto which the *assignments* are described.

1. **Knowing God's will:** (Trust in God, being transformed, asking correctly, able to hear.)
2. **Self-image:** (Not selfish, humble, valuable to God, guilt-forgiven, made by God.)
3. **Self-control:** (Slow to anger, language, lies/truth, overcome depression, sexual passion.)
4. **Handling stress:** (Call on God, no fear, not anxious, prayer life, peace of God.)
5. **Handling money:** (Treasure in heaven, content, no two masters, sowing, tithing, honest.)
6. **Compassion:** (Acting loving towards others, exercises forgiveness.)
7. **Servanthood:** (Submits, willing to serve & be corrected, able to listen, willing to learn.)
8. **Honesty:** (Has high ethical standards, can be trusted, openness, speaks truthfully.)
9. **Dependability:** (Reliable, on-time, can rely on his/her word, delivers on promises.)
10. **Tenacity:** (Does not give up, has stickability, is persistent, follows through.)
11. **Stewardship:** (Uses endowed talents, gives portion of earnings back, develops self.)
12. **Witness:** (Based on Word of God, is always prepared, has confidence, living example.)
13. **Prayer:** (High level of devotion, regular habit, is victorious in prayer, relies on God to rescue.)
14. **Obedience:** (To God's will, living in purity, able to control tongue, measures up.)
15. **Spirit-filled:** (Acts boldly, shows the fruit, the gifts are in operation, well controlled.)

Groupwork Assessment Criteria (10%)

1. **Preparation** for groupwork/discussion was done
2. Gives full **attention** – is not distracted by side issues
3. Points raised are **listened** to and **considered**
4. Takes relevant **notes** and makes written references
5. **Partakes** fully and is not shy or withdrawn
6. Does not **speak** for more than a fair share
7. Good **contributions** are made during the session
8. Questions and comments are **relevant** to topic
9. Encourages other group members and facilitator
10. Knows what needs to be done for the next session

Workfile Assessment Criteria (5%)

1. **Neatness:** Computer skills, binder used – can add
2. Only documents relevant to the course are included
3. **Complete:** tasks, assignments, worksheets, notes
4. **Notes & articles:** research used in assignments
5. **Reports:** projects undertaken and tasks done
6. Group discussion journals are included; are useful
7. Related documents are kept together
8. Organized documents - a reference index is used
9. Preparation for and result of **own** activities
10. The file is presentable at all times

Notes: RPL is a request and may be denied. The Tutor must be in possession of copies of all qualifications or CV referred to under points 1-7. With each module (there are 28 of them in the 8 courses) RPL may be applied for by indicating an **R** and a number from 1 to 7 as the source of the RPL claim, e.g.: **R** 3

Assignments are marked by the Tutor (optional) as well as by us. This may give the tutor an input with regards to the mark for the assignment. Tests are an alternative to some assignments. Will notify when available on the Website.
